

VOICE Secures Major Victories in Foreclosure, Youth Investment, & Affordable Housing in 2013

Organizing Work Featured in USA Today, CNN, & Washington Post



\$30 million Commitment for Housing Pilot in Prince William

Our Bank & Foreclosure Accountability Campaign secured \$30 million in commitments for VOICE's Prince William Restoration Fund from Bank of America, General Electric, and VA Housing Development Authority (VHDA). The fund will support a pilot that would (1) rehab 100 abandoned / blighted properties in neighborhoods devastated by foreclosure for affordable home ownership & rental housing, and (2) allow for the development of 1,500 units of rental housing over the next 15 years in Northern Virginia for families. VOICE announced the commitments at 500+person action in Woodbridge, VA with Senator Mark Warner and representatives from Bank of America, General Electric, and VHDA. When JPMorgan refused to participate in the restoration fund, VOICE organized a direct action at their DC Private Banking Offices with 60 leaders. We'll be focused like a laser on JPMorgan in 2014. VOICE's pioneering work has garnered significant national media coverage by USA Today, CNN, and the Washington Post. See all of VOICE's media coverage from the last 6 months.

Youth Investment Organizing Secures \$3 Million for Fields



VOICE congregations - Bethlehem Baptist Church, Good Shepherd Catholic Church, St. Luke's Episcopal Church, & Mt Vernon Unitarian Church – partnered with West Potomac and Mount Vernon high schools' athletic booster clubs in a campaign to end disparities in the facilities that Route 1 youth use to play. In 2013 we increased the number of youth from Audubon Mobile Home Park, a heavily-immigrant community, involved in soccer & secured a commitment from the manager to build a mini-soccer field on the property, and won \$3 million from Fairfax County & FCPS to renovate the athletic fields at West Potomac & Mount Vernon high schools to synthetic turf. Arlington Affordable Housing Gains

VOICE organized and helped secure a zoning variance for 77 new affordable housing units being created on land owned by Arlington Partnership for Affordable Housing (APAH).

Off of this successful effort we launched an Arlington Affordable **Housing Campaign** at an action with 550 leaders to get **Arlington County to** build 1,500 new affordable rental units for families making less than \$50,000/year on public and non-profit owned land in the next 3-5 years. This fall, VOICE is working to get 10,000 signatures for a petition to the county board backing our effort.

Tenant Actions in Fairfax

We organized a 250-person One Reston Walk where VOICE leaders and Crescent Apartments tenants got Board of Supervisors Chairperson Bulova and Supervisor Hudgins to support tenants with their goal of returning to the redeveloped complex. In Fairfax City, we organized with Layton Hall tenants to successfully get the city council to require a developer to provide more generous relocation assistance to 110 tenants and include 5% affordable units in the redeveloped complex. This is the first time Fairfax City has imposed affordable housing requirements on

developers.



New Members & Training in Alexandria

We are celebrating 3 new exploratory members - Virginia Theological Seminary (VTS), Region 4 Episcopal Churches, & Church of the Resurrection—all in Alexandria! Word of our organizing is spreading! As a broad based organization, VOICE hopes to expand our membership to include unions, schools, business and employee associations, health centers, community groups and other voluntary associations. Also, VOICE hosted our first-ever Metro IAF 3-Day Training on Organizing & Institutional Development June 13-15th in partnership with the VTS and the Episcopal Diocese of VA. We had 72 attendees and look forward to hosting more trainings in Virginia.

VOICE organized meetings with religious, business, and education leaders in Representatives Frank Wolf (R) VA-10 & Robert Wittman (R) VA-8 districts to create a broad base for Comprehensive Immigration Reform. We also raised \$75.000 in our 2013 **Grassroots** Fundraiser, spearheaded by VOICE leaders selling ads to businesses & individual donors, to

hire a bi-lingual organizer in Fall 2013. We also held introductory Organizing Trainings in Spanish attended by 75+ new immigrant leaders from 9 VOICE institutions.
